

What's Love Got to Do With It? *(Extract from The Bonsai Conspiracy by Paul Anderson-Walsh)*

In the coming months we will be returning to the foundational issue of our gospel. The golden thread of love. By ascribing love the title of the golden thread it means that love is of highest value, and it will therefore be apparent to everyone that love is our sole imperative. But why ...?

It was the legendary Tina Turner, in her song of the same title, who asked the question, "What's love got to do with it?" My answer to that, as it applies to the Christian life, is an emphatic, "Everything!" Unlike Tina Turner, I do not believe that "it's just a second hand emotion." On the contrary, it is not even an emotion. Love is not a feeling, as mentioned before. It is a Person – The Person – God Himself loving. The Bible tells us that God is love [1 John 4:8]. This is distinct from saying that God has love.

In addition to His being Love, He is also Spirit [John 4:24]. Accordingly, it is not a quantum leap of charismatic logic to see that a spirit needs a body in order to manifest itself. It is an irony of breathtaking proportions that whilst we have been given such an over-realised view of demonic possession, we have, at the same time, such an under-realised view of divine "possession".

Mankind is indwelt by the spirit of love. Man is, by nature, a lover. However, as we learned in Chapter 5 of this book, there are two principle types of "love" – Eros and Agapē, i.e. self-love and other-love. So, Man is either a self-lover (self-getting hedonist) or he is an other-lover (self-giving intercessor).

Eros says, "I love you because I need you."

Agapē says, "I need you because I love you."

The Apostle John's description of God as love suggests that "love" is a noun rather than a verb. Love is a Person [1 John 4:8]. The Apostle John states that "God is love", not that He loves but that He is love.

In his book, "Lifetime Guarantee", Bill Gillham notes that the word "sin" appears forty-one times in Romans 5-8; forty times it appears as a noun while only once does it appear as a verb [Rom. 5:12]2. There is a view which suggests that "sin" is not something a person does but it is something which a person is or, in the case of the Christian, is no longer. With this in mind, we can return to Tina Turner's question, "What's love got to do with it?" Let me now expand on my initial answer. Since love describes our essential nature and our nature speaks of our essence (our ego, the essential us), the kind of love with which we express is of supreme importance.

In Bible speak, these two operating principles are differentiated in terms of living in different realms – the realm of the flesh and the realm of the Spirit. However, in recent years, the concept of living in the Spirit has been so carnalised that one might go as far as to say that in some circles, we are attempting to live by the Spirit in the flesh. Let's make it our business as spiritual people to live at a higher level.
